
Cheekwood Member Appreciation Station Monday, March 15th 9am-1pm - Bradford Robertson Color Garden

The hardcover book, titled Cheekwood, offers an unprecedented window into the family home of Leslie Cheek and his wife Mabel Wood, investors in the family Maxwell House Coffee business. Richly illustrated with 135 photographs, the book explores the creation of the extraordinary historic estate designed by Bryant Fleming in the 1930s, with its Georgian-revival mansion, formal gardens, and expansive viewsheds and vistas.

This past June National Garden Clubs, Inc. awarded ICGC 1st Place in the Civic Projects with Native Plants and Wildflowers category for their restoration of the historic garden with emphasis on plant material native to our region. Club members undertook the garden restoration in 2018 with two objectives: to enhance the historical significance of Travellers Rest, and to present the garden as an outdoor educational resource for demonstrating the purpose and uses of herb gardens during the 18th and 19th centuries.
