In March Town and County took a drive in the country to Springfield, TN for an up close look at TN Urban Farms. They attended the HSMT January Meeting and were introduced to Tower Gardens and wanted to learn more about Tower Farms.

After a tour of the green house and more on how Tower Gardens are the new way to garden, they were treated to lunch by host Mona Hitch. On the menu was a custom made mason jar salad of greens right off the tower.



TYNE MEADE GARDEN CLUB

In May members of Tyne Meade visited the Greenhouses at Vanderbilt University.

The main theme of the specimens at Vandy are tropicals. Much research has gone into how to get these fragile unique plants to bloom. The group learned that half the greenhouses were considered cool houses as opposed to hot houses. This is due to much of the tropics being mountainous which has cooler temps in the elevations. In keeping with the Cheekwood pineapple symbol, host Jonathan Ertelt presented his annual pineapple plant. Many years ago Jonathan was the Garden Director at Cheekwood.









Then most recently Tyne Meade followed up their August meeting on the Land Trust for TN with a visit to Glen Leven Farm on Franklin RD in Nashville. Glen Leven Farm is an historic farm given to The Land Trust in 2006 by Susan M. West, a descendant of Nashville settler Thomas Thompson who came to Nashville with James Robertson in the late 1780s. Today, The Land Trust for TN conserves this hidden gem as a place that illuminates all aspects of its work —it is an historic, urban farm that serves as a recreational and educational resource and the office for The Land Trust's Middle Tennessee staff.

They concluded their visit with a tour of the Hermitage Hotel City Café Garden cared for by farmer Sarah Bush. She gave them an entertaining overview of how she cares for the 2 acre garden pretty much on her own. 
